we give facts:

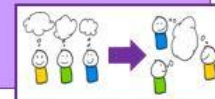
"We learned that"

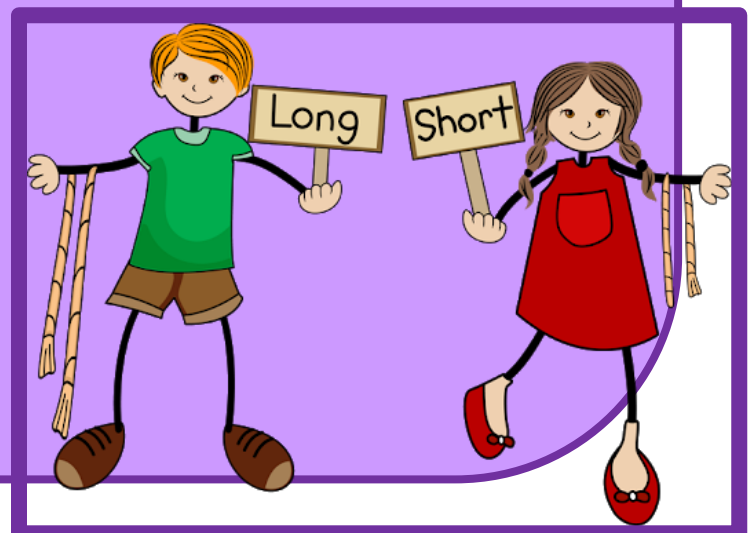

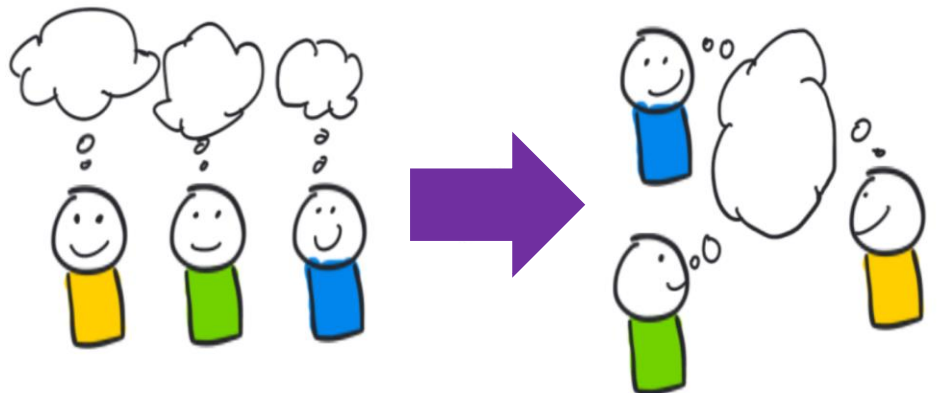
